Where do I sleep?

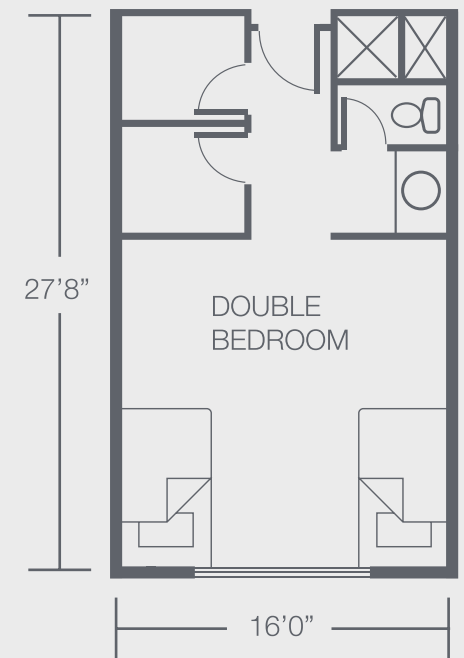
Housing

Check out the features of each one.

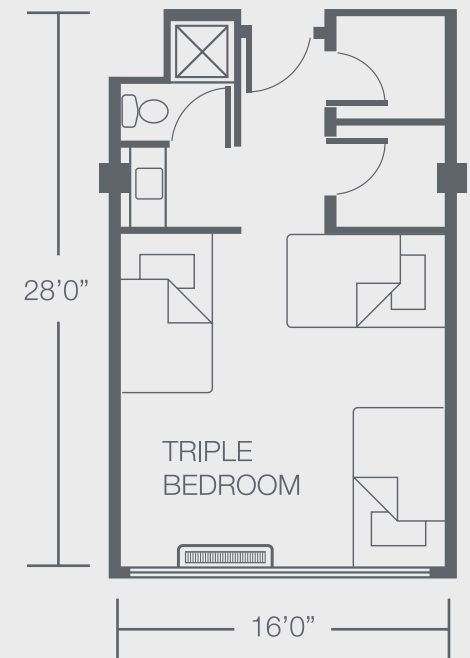
E.M. Lynn Residence Center:

- meditation lounge



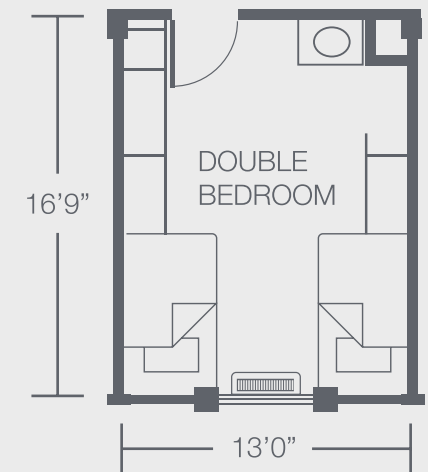
Lynn Residence Center:

- ping pong and pool tables in the lobby



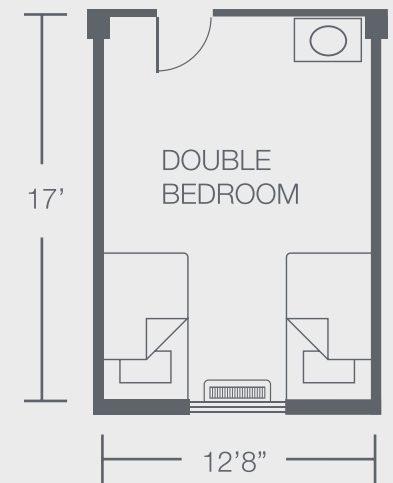
Trinity Residence Hall:

- large lobby space for activities and hanging out with friends



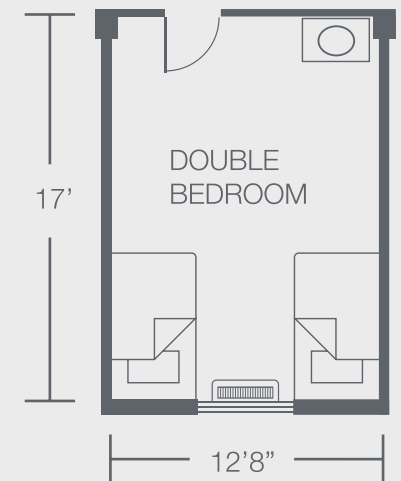
de Hoernle Residence Hall:

- a parking lot right outside the building

- gathering areas with a fire pit, grills and hammocks
- a large outdoor hangout area
- two large courtyards for activities and hanging out with friends
- most single rooms are located in Freiburger

Dining

A lot! Students who live on campus have plenty of dining options and healthy choices.

Elmore Dining Commons

Our dining hall is open 24/7! That's right. Eat what you want, how much you want and when you want (need a snack at 3 a.m.? No problem!) And check out the choices:

- deli and bakery with fresh-baked bread
- soup and salad island with local selections
- vegetarian/vegan for all diets: heart-healthy, gluten-free, soy and dairy-free dishes
- beverage station features Coke Freestyle machine
- sundae bar with toppings galore
- "My Kitchen" island featuring local guest chefs, internationally inspired dishes, farm-to-table menu choices
- an outdoor patio kitchen and grill

Getting around: Transportation

Even though everything on campus is only a few steps away, we've made it easy for you to get around with or without a car: **Yes, you can bring your wheels!** All students receive a **FREE campus parking sticker**, and you can park at one of **several parking lots around campus**.

No car, no problem:

- A free shuttle operates to and from campus with all-important stops at the mall, the beach (remember, this is South Florida) and the Tri-Rail station.
- Borrow a custom Lynn bike free of charge, and combine transportation and exercise.
- Rent a car—daily, weekly or monthly—right from campus through UCar share.
- Get easy access to public transportation with Palm Tran and Tri-Rail.

Other places to know and go

- Get your supplies at the campus store: gifts, souvenirs, food or drinks.
- You'll definitely need to check out the Lynn Library. It's a beautifully designed building housing books, periodicals, videos, computer workstations and more. You'll find tons of services and resources to help you with your courses and research projects. The Lynn Library is a quiet place to study or just hang out—and don't forget Perper Coffee House right inside the door.

Free fitness classes:

yoga, karate & self-defense, aerobics, Zumba, Lynn 90X, water aerobics, kickboxing

Intramurals:

flag football, volleyball, kickball, billiards, ping pong

Club sports:

dance, cheer, soccer

Facilities:

Two swimming pools open: 7 a.m.–8 p.m., tennis courts, sand volleyball, outdoor basketball
